A COUPLE OF CHANGES

Next Friday [9th February] is Alycia McLaren's last day with us as she is moving on to her new job in Health.

Unfortunately, we have been unable to recruit a replacement at this time, so the following temporary plan was agreed with governors this week.

From next week [5th February] Mrs Jeffrey will be returning to her full-time hours and will be taking over the teaching of Explorers Class in the afternoons with Ms West teaching Pioneers every afternoon. Reception will be staying in Squirrels classroom in the afternoons with Sam Wonacott working with them to ensure they are accessing an appropriate curriculum.

Friday afternoons will continue as before, and I will be covering both teachers 1 afternoon per week for PPA time.

By not teaching, I will then be free-ed up to manage the planning and admin of the Pre-School which will continue to be staffed by Helen Sinton and a rota of school TAs, with me dropping in each day, in the short term. We will also continue to be supported by Amy Roots and the LA.

As I have said this is planned to be a temporary solution and we will be looking at the role and hopefully recruiting a new manager for the Burrow early in the summer term once the budget for next year is set.
